

The Parish of Moy

The united parish of Moy and Dalara-
-se Moy from the Irish Maigh signifies
a meadow or plain; and Dale.
Fergusse is Fergus valley this parish
stretcheth on both sides of the
river about 15 miles and is strictly
called Swathern a part of the
ancient Earldom of Moray. on
the south west of the river above
the Steins the Davock of Moy
jutteth north west. among the
above two miles in the middle of which
is the Loch of Moy a mile long
and half a mile broad. Here is an
Island. the Lords of MacIntosh
had a house as yet entire. where
they resided in times of trouble
Now they have Moy Hall a good

house and convenient summer seat
at the west end of the Loch.
The Lands of Moy were purchased
from the Bishop of Moray
and MacIntosh took an new rig-
ht from Bishop Hepburn in Oct
1545 (per MacIntosh) Above Moy on
that side of the river are Tomatin
pertaining to a Gentleman of the
name of McQueen Fore belonging
to McIntosh of Holm and the
lands of Kyllachy, all holding of
of the lands Earl of Moray
The property of Alexr McIntosh
of London Merchant the ninth
in decent of the family of Kyll-
achy above Kyllachy is Chorm-
saw. The property of Kilbrar-
ck from the year 1460

On the north east of the river in
the lower end of the parish is Polloc-
hach the property of McQueen of
that place. Next up the river is
Corebuck the heritage of McIntosh
of Corebuck above which is Corebuck
McQueen the property of Donald
McQueen Chief of that branch of
the Clanchattan some miles far-
ther up is Dalnagavie, this was
a part of the estate of Westfield
given by Sir Alexr Dunbar to his
son David in 1495 disposed
to Cambell of Calder in 1608 and
fenced by him to Lauchlan McIntosh
of Kyllachy in 1614 whose great
grandson Donald McIntosh now
enjoyeth it. Above Dalnagavie
on both sides of the river is the
Drooch of Sevin

which was a part of the Castle lands of
Inverness and given by the Earl of Huntly
as a part of asscgments for the murder of
Mac Intosh in 1558 and it is the property
of the Intosh
